Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive

Dear Editor:

We are very pleased to share that we collected 34,634 pounds of food during the 27th Annual Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive on Saturday, May 11. Sheboygan joined more than 10,000 cities and towns across the U.S. to participate in this National Association of Letter Carriers' nation-wide tradition that takes place every second Saturday May.

On Saturday morning, local National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC) and Wisconsin Rural Letter Carriers Association (WIRLCA) unions and their members did double duty – delivering mail and picking up donations put out near mailboxes. Letter Carriers working in Sheboygan, Howards Grove, and Kohler collected items for Sheboygan County Food Bank (SCFB), while Letter Carriers in other local communities worked directly with their local food pantries.

In Sheboygan, Letter Carriers drove their trucks packed full of donations back to the Sheboygan Post Office, where SCFB volunteers used box trucks to transfer the donations to SCFB's warehouse. At the warehouse, more volunteers were ready to receive the donations and efficiently organize the food into pallet boxes. Volunteers also used their personal vehicles to assist Letter Carriers in picking up donations on their routes.

Special thanks to the NALC/WIRLCA unions and their members, Tod Roe and Lisa Skrube (local Food Drive coordinators), the local Postmaster, local churches and businesses that provided large groups of SCFB volunteers, individual SCFB volunteers, and our generous community members who donated food items. We would also like to thank Meijer, Starbucks on N. 14th Street, Theo's Pizza, Old Wisconsin, and Lakeside Pepsi for helping fuel our local Letter Carriers and volunteers.
